


Adrian Brantley-\$3,000 Scholarship


Bella Esposito - \$3,000 Scholarship


Nicole Kaufeldt - \$4,000 Scholarship


Nathaniel Luis Blackmon – \$4,000 Scholarship

In 1989, Alabama's hospitality and tourism industry created a scholarship program to recognize outstanding achievement by college students majoring in hospitality/tourism-related fields. Since that first \$500.00 scholarship was presented 34 years ago, our industry has raised over \$475,000 for this worthy cause that helps students on their way towards a successful hospitality/tourism career.

To qualify for a scholarship, a student must be working toward a degree in the field of hospitality, tourism, hotel, restaurant/food service management or culinary arts. They must be well-established in the program and must maintain a 2.5 out of 4.0 Grade Point Average, must show participation in industry functions and must demonstrate leadership both on and off-campus.
